



### **FAQ**

#### Why New York?

New York has an amazing array of musical education and entertainment opportunities in an easily accessible area. Our goal is to provide a fun, enriching, *music centered* learning experience.

#### Why does it cost so much?

The original quote we received from two different travel companies was higher. To lower the cost, we decreased the attractions and traveled overnight. It is a higher cost than our trip planned in 2020 because of inflation and gas prices.

### FAQ

#### What about safety?

New York is very different from Winchester! Our trip must be approved through the school board where it is carefully evaluated for educational value and safety. An administrator is also required to go with us. We carefully chose an experienced tour company owned by a music educator that frequently arranges these trips for high school music programs with safety in mind. The areas of New York that we will be in are high tourist areas with increased police presence. The trip is also highly structured with carefully planned "free time".

Crime is a concern in any larger city. It is important to be careful and aware of your surroundings. We would encourage you to visit the NYPD's website where you can look at crime statistics for specific locations. Safety is our top priority for the students and we are confident that we can give them a safe, educational, and meaningful experience in New York.
