

# **Sherando High School Color Guard 2022**

Color Guard is a team sport. It allows students to work with their peers, challenge themselves, enhance their communication and time management skills, and entertain audiences of all kinds. Through dance, flag, rifle, and sabre choreography, color guard performers in grades 9 through 12 will tell a visual story—while competing with other Virginia marching band programs.

The Sherando High School Color Guard program has been active since 1993. The program has continued to grow throughout the years. The 2022 Winter Guard program placed in the top 5 at each competition they attended. They won 1<sup>st</sup> place and were able to get promoted into the next class. We participate in multiple events throughout the entire year such as:

- Apple Blossom Parade & Festivities
- Guard/band camp
- Fall Contest Season
- Home Football games
- Winchester & Middletown Holiday Parade
- Winter Guard Contest Season

### Attendance

We are offering Color Guard as a Co-Curricular Activity this year. *It is NOT mandatory to be enrolled in the class to participate in the fall or winter seasons*; however, we do offer it as a class option for students (Day 1, 7<sup>th</sup> period). Those participating in the class will be held to the same attendance requirements as other courses. The grade for Color Guard class is solely based on attendance. <u>Class time</u> will be utilized for individual rehearsal time and equipment preparation. Evening rehearsals are used as group rehearsals. In order to participate in the winter guard season, students must participate in fall season whether color guard or in marching band.

Evening and weekend rehearsals are <u>required</u> by all members (those that are AND are not in the class). These rehearsals are used for an ensemble perspective such as learning movement and equipment technique, new choreography, and editing any show design concepts. Any absences from a rehearsal will require a written excuse from a parent or doctor including the reason for the absence. These can be written directly to Kayla within 24 hours of the absence. Work is not an excused absence. Please inform your employer of the rehearsal and performance schedule. If a student has one unexcused or two excused absences from a rehearsal within a one-week period, they may not be allowed to participate in that week's performances. If a student has missed a rehearsal, excused or unexcused, it is their responsibility to make up what was missed. Any absence issues will be dealt with on an individual basis.

Attendance for performances are required. These include all competitions and local parades occurring in the winter season. Calendars are given in May to help prepare for the upcoming season. Below are a few other <u>required</u> events:

- Evening Rehearsals
- All Home Football Games
- All Saturday day camps & Tag Day
- All Saturday contest days
- Holiday Parades throughout the season

Color Guard is a team sport. Our time together is valuable. We rely on one another and hold each other accountable. In order to grow as a team, we must all be present and attentive.

## Rehearsals

Being on time is arriving 10 minutes early. Being on time is late. Being late is unacceptable. Please arrive to rehearsal and be ready to begin at the noted time. Our time together as a team is valuable. Lateness can result in individual or group consequences such as running laps or push-ups.

A normal rehearsal consists of about 20 minutes of body warm-up and movement, 10-20 minutes of equipment technique, and the rest of the time will be working on show content. Day camps will be predominantly learning drill and choreography for the winter show and offer some leadership and group activities.

### Etiquette

- Open mind & positive attitude
- Team Spirit
- Holding yourself accountable
  - Punctual
  - If you are struggling, make time outside of rehearsal to practice and ask for help if needed
  - o Taking care of equipment, uniforms, etc.
- Follow the appropriate dress code:
  - Dark colored shorts, capris, or leggings (we need to see your ankles and feet)
    - <u>NO jeans</u> or short shorts o Dark colored shirts (long-sleeve, t-shirts, or tank tops)
    - All spaghetti strap shirts MUST be worn with a sports bra O Minimal to no jewelry O Hair pulled back and out of face
  - Tennis shoes must be worn to every rehearsal
- Minimal talking in rehearsals; excessive talking could result in laps or push-ups
- No spinning when someone is talking
- Show respect to fellow members, directors, parents, and band members
- \* <u>Keep all non-guard related issues at the door. If a situation arises, please notify a director</u> immediately.

# Safety

Color Guard can be a dangerous sport. All instructional practices are created to encourage and strengthen our members mentally and physically. If you have a preexisting injury, please notify us along with documentation from your doctor. If you are hurt during a rehearsal, please notify a director immediately. We will take the necessary actions needed to ensure the member does not increase the injury.

If you are feeling sick or experienced a recent injury, it is up to YOU on how much you participate. This is based on you knowing your limits and how much you can handle. Like mentioned before, this is a team sport where everyone holds themselves accountable. There is a difference between being hurt or sick and just giving up because you're tired, bored, etc. If you need a moment, inform a director and take a few minutes.

# Fees/Expenses

All members will have a responsibility to fill out one calendar for the fall season and one calendar for the winter season. Calendar Day funds go towards the following: uniforms/gloves, silks, equipment, show shirt, show make-up, instruction, design/choreography fees, props/tarp, competition

fees, transportation, etc. The fall calendar money is due by the end of band camp, August 12<sup>th</sup>. There are numerous fundraisers & payment plans available in order to pay fees.

Students will be responsible for purchasing the following: foundation, mascara/eyeliner, hair supplies, black attire (leggings, t-shirt/tank top), and Guard Jacket.

There are multiple fundraising opportunities students can take advantage of to help contribute to their fees and the band booster organization. Some of these include:

We may set up specific fundraising opportunities such as car washes, bake sales, etc. to go towards our guard account.

We will be traveling to various competition sites in the winter season. All school rules and policies are in effect are expected to be followed at all rehearsals and competitions. Any violation by students or parents will be disciplined according to the Frederick County Schools handbook.

Not only are we representing the Sherando High School band program, we are representing Sherando H.S., Frederick County Schools, and our community. Represent them with integrity and pride.
