- Bookkeeping Discussion and Vote
 - Phil provided a quick overview and explained why we needed the bookkeeper position and went over some of the responsibilities of the role.
 - Danielle Jones asked some questions about this and expressed interest in the Treasurer position.
 - Phil passed out papers for a quick YES/NO vote and then collected them.
 - Liz White counted the votes and it was announced the bookkeeper position was approved.
- Treasurer's Report Sandy Smith
 - It was reported that we had around \$10,000 in profit from the Sherando Showcase Indoor Competition.
 - Sandy also mentioned that a few checks to the tour company for the NY trip have not cleared yet, so the P/Ls are a little off.
- Current Committee Updates
 - Advancement/Fundraising
 - Touch A Truck Sandy Smith
 - 23 Vehicles have confirmed their participation
 - A few food vendors are confirmed as well
 - Waiting to hear about a helicopter. Noelle Callas will reach out to a contact of hers to see if they would be willing to participate.
 - Sandy is asking others to recommend other "trucks" who might be willing to participate.
 - It was brought up to use the red band trailer, with kid safe touchable/playable instruments, this is a band event after all!
 - HundredX Adam Stein
 - As of now 47 people have signed up for HundredX.
 - Adam went over the highlights of the program and encouraged us all to participate. If 100 people complete all 75 opinions, the band would get \$15,000. Just imagine if each of those people were able to get one friend to also do all 75 opinions. That dollar value would double. This is an easy way for the band to make a lot of money.

- Indoor competition Kayla Wright
 - Sherando Showcase Debrief
 - Thanks to all who supported the event. Received positive feedback from judges about hospitality and directors. They are looking forward to Sherando hosting another competition.
 - Joel shared a message from Clarke County HS director, with a positive message about his experience at the Showcase.
 - 680 paid spectators
 - Almost 2000 people came to the competition
 - made around \$10,000 in profit
 - \$3,350 in sponsorships.
 - 350 unique visitors to the digital program website
 - Sherando Showcase Open Feedback
 - Signage was great
 - Might be good to have someone helping direct groups from the parking lot into the school.
 - We liked the updated flow of travel to maximize group queueing into the gym.
 - Need for more bathrooms or possible dressing rooms
 - Suggestion to somehow use aux gym as percussion tarp folding location
 - We may need to have printed schedules available.
 - Provide guides for all units, whether required or not
 - It was noted that many bus drivers asked for passes into event.
 No comp offered that. Each school is required to use one of their volunteer passes or purchase a pass for drivers, if they want to watch the competition. Kayla will ask AIA to make this more clear in the general guidelines for next year.
 - Feel free to message Kayla directly with any additional feedback/suggestions!
