1. Fundraising

- a. Running a band program of this size requires significant financial support.
- b. Fundraising is one of the boosters' most essential responsibilities.
- Band fees are critical, but they only cover part of the cost other fundraising efforts fill the gap.

2. Support Our Students Through Donations

- a. We organize donations of specific supplies the Amazon Wishlist.
 This year's Wishlist will be available soon.
- b. We seek business donations whenever possible. Monetary and items.
- c. Water is always in high demand especially for competition and parade days. We go through 2 pallets of water bottles per year!

Everything that is donated will go directly to benefit the students.

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3. Student and Staff Support

- a. We provide meals like tailgate dinners for students on game nights.
- b. Boosters assist with uniforms, helping to distribute, maintain, and organize them.
- volunteers help monitor student safety and behavior by being present and attentive.
- d. We help design, build, and transport props for field shows and competitions.
- e. Boosters serve as advocates for the band program and music education in the community.

Ideal for introverts Behind-the-scenes



Task oriented roles with minimal social expectations. Great for those who don't like being the center of attention.



Balanced roles, Working in teams within specified timeframes.



Direct engagement with strangers and public facing roles, including fundraising and other outreach efforts.



Perfect for the always extroverted. Juggles personalities, multitasking, and dealing with the unexpected.

Volunteer - Band Camp

Estimated Social Battery: |||||



Time Commitment: Varies depending on shift selection. **When:** Monday - Friday (7/28-8/1 & 8/4-8/8)

What You'll Do: You'll meet everyone, including 137 kids who don't know where their water bottle went. You'll be the glue that keeps camp running smoothly—hydrated, fed, organized, and maybe even have a little fun.

Your duties may include:

- setting up tents, refilling water jugs,
- handing out ice packs,
- being the calm in the storm of 100+ marching musicians learning to step off on the correct foot.
- You'll be a lifeline for students and staff—and possibly the reason the flutes don't mutiny by Wednesday.
- This is ideal for helpers with flexible summer hours, parents who want a sneak peek at the marching show, or anyone who enjoys saying "drink more water" 500 times a day.





Volunteer - Logistics Team

Estimated Social Battery:



Time Commitment: Varies - 3 to 10 hrs/wk **When:** Primarily during marching band season, other small tasks throughout the year.

What You'll Do: This team works closely with the band staff, the Logistics Coordinator, and other parents keeping the many mechanics of the marching band running smoothly.

This includes: Prop construction and maintenance, trailer loading and unloading, prop assembly at football games and competitions.

This is literally the group that keeps the band moving. Great for parents who like to be hands-on working with other parents and students. Great opportunities to show off your creative carpentry, fabrication, or 3D printing skills.





Volunteer - Bus Chaperones

Estimated Social Battery:



Time Commitment: Varies - 4-15 hrs/event **When:** Saturdays during marching season. Various parades throughout the year.

What You'll Do:

 Ride with students to competitions and parades—making sure everyone's safe and accounted for.

 Assist with headcounts, snacks, minor crises ("I forgot my shoes!"), and be the grown-up presence that says, "We're watching, but with love." =)

Have a front-row seat to the joy, nerves, and excitement of band travel.
 The kids might pretend they don't notice you... but they notice. And they're grateful.

This is perfect for calm, friendly adults with a good sense of humor, a charged phone, and a backpack full of band-aids and snacks.





Volunteer - Uniforms Team

Estimated Social Battery:



Time Commitment: Varies depending on event and season.

When: Year-round opportunities

What You'll Do:

 Help make sure students look sharp, stay clean, and has a uniform that actually fits.

 From initial fittings to weekly maintenance, you'll help manage our wardrobe of magic.

Be the go-to hero for lost gauntlets, wrinkled jackets, and grass stains.

Be a superstar in the shadows, Run an extra load or two of

Iaundry after events to keep our uniforms looking their best.

Volunteer - Hospitality Team

Estimated Social Battery:



Time Commitment: 2-3 hrs home football games 4-5 hrs for other events

When: Year-round opportunities

What You'll Do:

Nourish the spirit (and the stomachs) of our band family.

 Sets up and serves meals or refreshments at a variety of events—think band camp lunches, potluck dinners, and event hospitality for band directors and competition judges.

 Hospitality volunteers are also known for creating a welcoming vibe—be it a potluck table under a pop-up tent or a chili dinner in the cafeteria.

• Bring the warmth, the plates, and maybe a tablecloth or two.

If you enjoy planning fun activities and interacting with the kids, then this is the team for you!





Volunteer - Prop Pushers

Estimated Social Battery:



Time Commitment: 2–4 hours per event **When:** Football games and competitions



 Help get large props onto and off the field before and after performances—quickly, quietly, and heroically.

• Assist the Logistics Team with trailer loading and unloading as needed.

Be a vital part of the band's visual storytelling, helping the show come

to life.

This is ideal for those who don't mind running in closed-toe shoes, enjoy a challenge under pressure, and think moving scenery is the most fun part of Broadway.





Volunteer - Trailer Drivers

Estimated Social Battery:



Time Commitment: Varies depending on event and season.

When: Year-round opportunities.

What You'll Do:

 Haul the band's equipment trailer(s) to and from competitions, football games, and other performances.

- You don't need a CDL, but you do need confidence, common sense, and an appreciation for how many instruments it takes to create a halftime show.
- Work closely with the Logistics and Prop teams to make sure everything arrives in one piece and on time.
- The Logistics Team will handle the actual packing (unless you're one of those folks who needs to rearrange it... in which case, have at it)

Bonus points if you've ever said, "Let me handle the tie-down straps."

Ongoing - Earns Money For Your Students' Band Acct.

Purchase gift cards for your everyday purchases:

- Hundreds of companies to choose from.
 - Gas, Grocery, Shopping, Entertainment, Travel, etc.
- Percent of purchase (up to 25%) will be applied directly to your student's band account.
 (% decided by retailer)
- You can earn up to \$1000/yr per participant.
- Purchase Physical, egift Card, or Reloadable Gift Cards on their website or mobile app, small fees apply per transaction.
 \$0.29 trans fee, debit card (1% fee), credit card (3% fee)
- Physical cards can be shipped to you or the coordinator.
- Egift cards are available in the RaiseRight app after purchase.
- Family and Friends can participate, helping your student.



2025 - 2026 Band Fee Info

The Band Fee for the 2025-2026 school year is \$180.00 + up to \$50.00 for Shoes. The Fee will be broken out into two parts and you will be responsible for paying for both.

Band Fees are due by August 8, 2025!

- 1. \$30.00 will need to be paid to the Frederick County Schools directly. You can pay this through MySchoolBucks or a check to the school. The Band Boosters can not transfer the funds so please don't pay this to the Boosters.
- **NOTE:** You may not be able to complete this until closer to the start of the school year, once schedules are finalized.
- \$150.00 will need to be paid to the Sherando Band Boosters. We have set up several ways to do this. See the grey box on this page.
- 3. Up to \$50.00 If your student needs new marching shoes.
- · Cash/Check
- Credit Card through SwipeSimple Marching Band Shoes (once we have a definite price from our vendor, we will add the SwipeSimple link).
- · Money that is in your students account.

*Convenience fees may apply for SwipeSimple transactions.

Ways to Pay the \$150 Fee

- Cash or Check (payable to SHSBBA). You can have your child put the payment in the Black Box. Please make sure their name is on the envelope or check memo.
- 2. Credit Card through SwipeSimple Band Fee.*
- Money that is in your students account. Please contact our Treasurer if you need to get your total and then advise if you'd like to have the money transferred to their fee and/or their band shoes.
- 4. Payment Plan 3 Payments during the fall season.
- 1. August 1st \$50*
- 2. September 5th \$30* + \$30 MySchoolBucks (Sherando Bookkeeper)
- 3. October 3rd \$60*
- * Pay to SHSBBA in band room black box
- 5. Calendar Days Fundraiser. The first \$150 raised will go towards their band fee so it's a great opportunity for them to raise money for themselves and for the band. Learn more about the Calendar Days Fundraiser.



Uniforms - Summer Fittings

Things to know about our uniforms.

- There are no direct uniform costs for families. It's built into the band fee.
- We do **require** each student purchase band shoes as needed. Costs may be up to \$50.
 - Shoe Form and Fee due by 8/1.
- ALL students need to sign up for fittings 7/21-7/24 5:30pm-8:00pm
 Sign up will be opening soon. Watch for updates in your email.
- **Volunteers needed** to help maintain these uniforms. No experience required.
